Program Highlights

- McDonald's® franchisees have always placed a high value on education and are committed to helping further education within the communities in which they do business. For this reason, McDonald's Family Restaurants of Greater Washington, D.C., has decided to honor youth who are leaders in school and within their communities.
- Qualified applicants are high school seniors residing in the Greater Washington, D.C., and outlying areas (counties included are listed below). These students will have participated in a variety of extracurricular community activities, demonstrated outstanding leadership skills and achieved academic excellence.
- Each winner will be awarded a \$1,500 scholarship that will go directly to the college or university where the recipient plans to attend college. Winners will be recognized in the spring of 2009.

You're eligible if...

The program is open to students who are currently **high school seniors** who demonstrate:

Leadership, by serving in leadership positions in school, church or community organizations.

Community Service, by volunteering their spare time to help those in need and providing support to local groups, business and neighborhood organizations.

Scholarship, by maintaining at least a "B" average (3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale), and by having applied or planning to apply to an accredited college or university.

Character, by setting a good example for their peers, maintaining a positive attitude, and exhibiting qualities of good citizenship, high moral character and ethical behavior.

Geographic Eligibility, by attending high school in one of the counties or independent cities served by the McDonald's Family Restaurants of Greater Washington, D.C. Those counties and independent cities are:

- **In Maryland** – Alleghany, Calvert, Carroll, Charles, Cumberland, Frederick, Garrett, Montgomery, Prince George's, St. Mary's and Washington.
- **In Virginia** – City of Alexandria, Arlington, Clarke, Culpeper, City of Fairfax, Fairfax, City of Falls Church, Fauquier, City of Fredericksburg, Frederick, King George, Loudoun, City of Manassas, City of Manassas Park, Page, Prince William, Rappahannock, Shenandoah, Spotsylvania, Stafford, Warren, Westmoreland and City of Winchester.
- **In West Virginia** – Berkeley, Hampshire, Grant, Hardy, Jefferson, Mineral and Morgan.
- **District of Columbia**

The goal of this program is to honor diversity and award scholarships across ethnic groups.

Descendants of McDonald's Owner/Operators or members of the selection committee are ineligible to apply for this scholarship.

McDonald's crew members and their families are eligible to apply.

What you need to submit

- A completed **McDonald's Educates Scholarship** application signed by the student and his or her parent or guardian.
- **Two typed or legibly handwritten short answers - a maximum of 200 words each.** Applicants should follow the guidelines below to prepare the short answers.
- An official high school **transcript**.
- A **letter of recommendation** from a teacher, guidance counselor, or someone with or for whom you have worked in your community service efforts. If you are a McDonald's crew member, you can ask your manager or Owner/Operator for a recommendation.

Tell us in your own words

One of the criteria for selecting a McDonald's Educates Scholarship winner is the applicant's ability to impact the selection committee with his/her thoughts on addressing relevant national and global issues and secondly, on the importance in developing an appreciation for cultural diversity.

The following **guidelines** are provided to assist applicants in their development of the short answer questions:

- The maximum length of each short answer is **200 typed or legibly handwritten words**. The short answers will not be returned to the applicant.
- **Short Answers will be judged on:**
 - **Creative Content** – ability to communicate a unique perspective and point-of-view.
 - **Idea Development** – ability to fully develop and explain the rationale presented.
 - **Writing Style** – correct grammar, spelling, punctuation and absence of typographical errors.

McDonald's Educates Scholarship recipients will receive scholarship monies that will be sent directly to his or her college of choice and might be featured in a publicity campaign.
